

RSE Parents' Information Evening

15 parents attended the evening and 14 parents completed the questionnaires. 1 was taken away to be completed but not returned yet.

The findings of the questionnaires are as follows:

- 100% (14/14) of parents said they felt that school supports the parents' role as first educators of their child.
- 93% (13/14) of parents said they were comfortable talking to their child's teacher about any concerns they might have regarding the RSE programme. 1 parent said 'not sure' and said, "Only because I'm not sure how she will deliver it.")
- 100% of parents said they felt that as a result of the presentation they have a good understanding of St Joseph's RSE programme.
- 65% (9/14) of parents said they would like the school to supply parents with information with suggestions on how to talk their child about puberty. 29% (4/14) said no, and 7% (1/14) said 'not sure'.

Other comments:

"Very informative, thank you."

"Baby steps advice about how to answer questions and managing discussions around puberty was really helpful."

3 Y5 parents commented that they are not convinced that Y5 is the right age to deliver this talk and are concerned that their children may ask questions that they are not ready to hear the answers to.
